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“TECH IS NOT JUST A TOOL”

From wearable devices to spatial computing,
Vivek Oberoi truly lives a life driven by technology

My fascination with technology

I remember being a student at Mayo College, watching the first home computers hum to life. There was this buzz; the realisation that a few lines of code could solve a complex, real-world problem. The fascination was never the hardware; it was the storytelling potential of the leverage it provides. Tech is the engine that has powered every pivot in my life—from my early days experimenting with software to building an entrepreneurial ecosystem. It is the difference between moving at the speed of tradition and leaping into the future. It is not just a tool; it is the wind beneath the wings of ambition.

Gadgets I cannot live without

My life is a constant blur across cities and industries, so my tools have to be frictionless. I wear a Whoop band—it

is like having a coach on my wrist, providing high-fidelity biometric data that helps me optimise my performance without me ever having to hunt for a screen. In place of standard eyewear, I have moved toward custom-engineered smart frames that act as a discreet command centre; they allow me to stay connected to my world while keeping my eyes on the person in front of me. And, of course, my AirPods Pro is my daily armour. When they go in, the world fades away, and I am either deep in a blueprint or finding the soul of a new creative narrative.

Implementing tech in every aspect of life—from my home to my car

I have always believed that technology should serve you, not demand your attention. My home is designed with

an intuitive automation layer—the lights and climate breathe with my schedule, creating an environment for me to recharge. On the road, I look for systems with high-level telemetry and clean, heads-up displays. I want the data but want to stay equally focused on the journey.

The AI prompts and models I use

I have moved beyond basic chatbots—I am looking for a partner in thought. Right now, I am utilising Claude 4.5 Opus for strategic reasoning; its ability to handle nuanced business logic is truly impressive. I also experiment with Grok 4.20 for real-time data and raw market sentiment.

One of my favourite techniques is something I call ‘The Character’s Compass’. I will feed a scene’s emotional arc into the model

and prompt it: "Identify the three deepest psychological blocks for this character and suggest five subtle, tech-augmented ways to bring that world to the screen." It is like having a 3am huddle with a brilliant acting coach, helping me find the pulse of a performance before the cameras roll.

Tech reviewers I follow

I value creators who see the intersection of design and engineering as an art form. Marques Brownlee is a staple for his aesthetic clarity and honest critiques. I also follow *The Verge* for their deep dives into how tech is reshaping the fabric of society. I look for voices that go beyond just talking about specs. I want to know how a product feels to live with. That is the same perspective I bring to my real

estate projects. It is never just about the building but about the experience of the soul within it.

The tech I want to try

I am watching Spatial Computing very closely. The idea of digital and physical worlds merging is beautiful but it comes with responsibility. As these tools become more powerful, we have to be more vigilant. We are entering an era where you can automate almost any decision, and that is exactly where the danger lives. Technology can be a double-edged sword; it can be misused to manipulate or distance us from reality.

Stakeholders need to take care in how they build these brains, and users must stay sharp. My rule—tech should make you more human, not less.

Investing in tech companies

My investment philosophy is about backing people who solve problems with empathy. iScholar is close to my heart, using tech to bring world-class education to every corner of India.

Then there is Rotoris, which is a tribute to mechanical brilliance. We are using advanced, precision engineering to put Indian luxury watchmaking on the global map. It is about proving that our craftsmanship is second to none. With Solitario, we have embraced cutting-edge technology to create lab-grown diamonds that are indistinguishable from mined ones, making luxury ethical and accessible. I do not just invest for a return; I invest in tech that has a story to tell and a life to improve.

Awareness about payment options, reward points, and grievance modes can help you stay ahead of the game when you travel

Premium credit cards are ideal for high-value purchases during international travel

If you are an Indian traveller heading overseas, you likely already know that how you pay is becoming just as crucial as where you pay. FICCI cites a Future Market Insights report that states that India will remain one of the world's fastest-growing outbound markets for the rest of the decade, fuelled by higher disposable incomes, better flight connections, and a highly aspirational middle class.

The established playbook

Premium credit cards

For frequent international travellers, a premium credit card is probably still the best option. You rack up reward points and air miles on every transaction and also get perks like complimentary lounge access. Plus, there is the peace of mind from built-in travel insurance, delay protection, and emergency help. Crucially, they offer robust consumer protection if things go sideways.

Yes, you will pay a foreign exchange markup of about 1.5 to 3.5 per cent per transaction. But if your card gives you accelerated miles on international spending, that will frequently offset the fee when you redeem them for flight upgrades or hotel stays.

Take your pick from the following:

HDFC Infinia and Diners Club Black

Great for flight and hotel rewards, with a massive global lounge network.

Axis Bank Magnus and Reserve

Perfect for luxury hotel partnerships, international dining privileges, and experience-led rewards.

ICICI Emerald Private Metal

Focused on lifestyle and offers concierge support.

American Express Platinum Charge

Elite choice for hotel status, curated global access, and end-to-end service.

RBL Bank Nova & Lumière

Tailored travel privileges for the globally mobile.

One massive advantage here is the chargeback. If a merchant overcharges you, a service is not delivered or you are a victim of fraud, your bank can reverse the transaction. Under Visa and Mastercard rules, you have up to 120 days to file a dispute. No other payment method has this level of safeguard.

Forex cards

Their biggest superpower? Locking in the exchange rate when you load the card, shielding you from volatility.

Some options to try in 2026:

Niyo Global: Zero forex markup, usable in over 130 currencies across more than 180 countries.

Thomas Cook Borderless Prepaid Card:

Holds up to 12 currencies, making it ideal for European tours.

HDFC Multicurrency Platinum

ForexPlus Chip Card: Supports more than 22 currencies and includes insurance cover.

Wise: Near-mid-market exchange rates with transparent fees, perfect if you are jumping between currency zones.

The downside? You do not earn rewards, reloading mid-trip can be cumbersome, and they lack the robust consumer protection of a credit card.

The new frontier

Digital wallets and international UPI are where the real innovation is happening and where most Indian travellers still have questions. A digital wallet is an app on your phone—like Google Wallet, Samsung Wallet or Apple Pay (yet to come to India)—that securely stores your credentials. When you tap your phone to pay at a checkout terminal, it communicates via Near Field Communication (NFC) technology. The crucial detail is that your card number is never transmitted. Instead, the wallet generates a unique, single-use token for each transaction and the merchant receives this token.

There are three types of wallets:

Open wallets (Google Pay, Samsung Wallet): Linked to your bank account or credit card, and usable at any NFC-enabled terminal, globally. This is what most Indian travellers generally use abroad.



Semi-closed wallets (PayPal, Venmo):

Accepted at specific merchant networks and useful for online purchases from international retailers.

Closed wallets (Amazon Pay, airline apps): Tied to a single brand, it is useful for loyalty points but not for spending.

By design, digital wallets are more secure than a physical card. Tokenisation means your card details are never exposed. There is zero risk of card skimming, a type of fraud common in tourist-heavy destinations. If you lose your phone, you can remotely disable the wallet. Plus, payments require biometric authentication so even physical possession of your phone does not allow someone to misuse it.

Remember, the safety net depends on where you are. Markets with mature regulatory frameworks—EU member states, Singapore, Japan, the UAE, and the UK—offer strong protection for digital payment users. In less-regulated markets, stick to a chip-and-PIN card or cash from bank-affiliated ATMs only.

And the big question: does it cost more or less than paying by card? Linking your credit card to Google Pay does not entail any extra fee.

Taking UPI global

UPI is now live in over eight countries, including the UAE, Singapore, Bhutan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, France, Mauritius, and Qatar. It is growing fast, with

UPI: Great for quick, low-value payments in countries where acceptance and connectivity is strong.

Cash: Always carry a small amount of local currency. Not every market is reliably cashless—particularly parts of Africa, rural Europe or less-digitised South Asian destinations.

NPCI International Payments Limited (NIPL) actively integrating it into more countries across Southeast Asia, the Middle East, and Europe.

But does it actually save the customer's money? According to a report from CNBC's *Inside India* newsletter: "Traditional banks and forex providers typically mark up the exchange rate by 3 to 3.5 per cent—and are not transparent about it. You might see 'zero fees' advertised, but they're [providers] making money by giving you a worse exchange rate... [on top of] dynamic currency conversion fees, foreign transaction fees... [and more]." UPI international payments carry a lower markup—usually around 0.5 to 2 per cent—depending on the bank. Because the payment moves directly from your Indian bank account to the merchant without routing through a card network, you cut out one layer of intermediary cost.

But is it as seamless as UPI in India? Not quite. UPI international payments require a working data connection. If

you are on a transit layover using spotty airport Wi-Fi, it may not function.

In addition, many banks still use OTP-based authentication for your first international transaction. If you switch to a local SIM abroad, receiving that OTP might fail. Moreover, even in supported countries, UPI is often unavailable at smaller merchants.

Can I reverse a UPI payment abroad if something goes wrong? This is a vital distinction for travellers. Under NPCI's updated chargeback rules effective July 2025, you can raise a dispute for unauthorised transactions, failed payments where money was debited or incorrectly charged through your UPI app, bank or the NPCI grievance portal. If you act within hours and the recipient's account still holds the funds, recovery rates can be high. However, unlike a credit card dispute where the bank provisionally reverses the charge while investigating, UPI disputes go through a bank-to-bank process that takes longer and offer no guaranteed reversal if the funds have already moved.

GEAR UP

Heading out? Do not forget to pack these simple devices that will go a long way in making travel easy

This is a great time to be a traveller. As airlines continuously upgrade their technology to make travel smoother, tech companies are building solutions to make journeys better.

1. Scale up: A portable digital luggage scale takes all the guesswork out of whether bags are overloaded. Some of them go beyond their obvious function, incorporating a tracker, flashlight, and even a tape measure. Others use kinetic energy to do the job, eliminating batteries from the equation altogether.

2. Do more: While universal travel adaptors have been a staple for a while now, a multi-device charging station is a handy tool to pack, considering how many devices one now carries on trips. Now found even at airports, they can charge smartwatches, earbuds, tablets, and phones—all at one go.

3. Always know: To make your luggage trackable, invest in AirTag, Tile Pro, and Galaxy SmartTag2 or similar devices from other brands and insert these into your suitcases. More so, since airlines like Air India allow you to upload your Property Irregularity Report (PIR) number onto their app. Then, once you share the tag location, use it to recover your lost baggage.

4. Stay connected: Once in the air, to consume In-flight Entertainment (IFE) with better sound and comfort, consider a Bluetooth transmitter for AirPods, earbuds or wireless headphones that allow you to connect your personal device to the IFE screen. If you would rather watch your own content, use noise-cancelling headphones and use a phone or tablet holder for hassle-free viewing. Finally, for silent sleep, pack earplugs like those from Loop or a travel headband with Bluetooth speakers to ensure you wake up refreshed.

OPPO FIND X9 PRO

This is my favourite travel phone because it combines strong camera performance with long battery life. You get a versatile camera setup (50MP main, 200MP telephoto, and 50MP ultra-wide), paired with a huge 7,500mAh battery. So, it will not run out of charge in the middle of your day.

I have enjoyed shooting 3x zoom photos, portraits, macro shots, and low-light images because of pleasing-looking *bokeh* (background blur) and well-tuned camera processing. Neon lights appear lively in low-light shots and Master mode gives you more control over the photos. Other notable features include XPAN mode for one-of-a-kind panoramic shots, improved Hasselblad colour tuning, and 4K video conversion from Live Photos.

Why buy: Performs best in low light; ideal for portraits and concerts

VIVO X300 FE

More often than not, companies reserve the best camera hardware for their flagship phones, which tend to be on the bigger side. They are not the most handy devices and could be uncomfortable to use with a single hand. The Vivo X300 FE is built for those of us who want high-end cameras without going big on an Android phone. It is a compact device with a 6.31-inch AMOLED display that does not compromise on camera quality.

This phone has a 50MP main camera, a 50MP telephoto sensor with 3x optical zoom, and an 8MP ultra-wide angle lens. The resulting photos have vibrant colours, rich contrast, and a good amount of detail. You can expect to get excellent daylight shots and good-looking portraits with it.

APPLE IPHONE 17 PRO SERIES

While this is generally regarded as an obvious choice, it is not usual for smartphone cameras to deliver uniform quality in colours with rich details and great dynamic range across all lenses. The new-generation Apple devices do so while also offering professional-grade editing flexibility with ProRaw images and ProRes Log video recording on its 48MP rear camera trio.

But the biggest upgrade is Apple's selfie shooter. The new 18MP Center Stage camera is arguably the best for vloggers who shoot using the front camera. You can hold the 17 Pro vertically and take horizontal videos with top-notch stabilisation, thanks to a new square image sensor.

XIAOMI 17 ULTRA

Photos shot on this camera phone have a distinct personality with strong character, which incite emotions in a way that you will not find on any other smartphone. It pairs industry-leading camera upgrades (LOFIC HDR technology, continuous optical zoom from 3.2x to 4.3x) with Leica tuning to offer versatile optics.

The Xiaomi 17 Ultra is a photographer's delight. You get an array of well-tuned filters to choose from, alongside an innovative camera hardware that delivers rich detail, great dynamic range and a sharp, contrasting look. I recommend using the Leica Authentic mode for more dramatic shots with slightly under-saturated colours and a mild vignette.

Alternatively, you can check out Moment lenses to expand the capabilities of your current Apple iPhone, Samsung Galaxy or Google Pixel phone. TO OR NOT TO AI

While artificial intelligence has made planning easy, over reliance can lead to it influencing your behaviour and worse, data misuse

AI excels at speed, price prediction, real-time updates, and it does better at these than any human, so, technology is not the problem, unconscious use of it is

Planning a trip once meant hours researching between browser tabs—looking at blogs for inspiration, browsing sites for fares, and checking reviews for reassurance. Today, that process has been quietly replaced. You open an app, type ‘weekend trip’, give a budget, and within a minute, a destination appears with an assembled itinerary and recommendations.

That is the thing about artificial intelligence (AI) in travel. It has become a co-pilot for modern journeys.

When AI curates your journey

The most dramatic shift in modern

travel begins before the journey does. Hours of research now condense into a single prompt. Platforms analyse your past bookings, browsing habits, and interests to suggest destinations before you have decided where you want to go. AI can now provide multi-day itineraries by considering your travel duration and adapting in real time if something changes.

Beyond planning, AI is now deeply embedded in bookings as well. Dynamic pricing tools scan millions of fare combinations across dates and routes. Airline websites personalise what you see based on your past preferences like seating choice,

preferred departure time, etc. Hotels have also caught up with platforms using AI to suggest properties, room upgrades or bundled deals.

You trust the prediction because of the vast historical data behind it, and the confidence is convincing.

Your on-ground digital guide

AI does not stop at the planning stage. It becomes an always-available assistant on the ground. Translation apps interpret conversations in real time and navigation tools guide you in unfamiliar places. Restaurant suggestions, attraction timings, and weather and transport updates are



instantly delivered. AI concierges anticipate preferences and handle hotel requests before you even plan to interact with the staff. For tech-savvy travellers, this level of live assistance feels like having a constantly-updating guide.

The hidden trade-offs

For all its convenience, AI also has its fair share of trade-offs. Every search, click, and booking help the machine learn more about you. It builds a detailed profile and subtly narrows your options. Destinations that do not fit your patterns quietly disappear, not because they are not worth visiting, but because the algorithm decided you probably would not prefer it.

This is AI bias in its plainest form. The system optimises for engagement, not discovery; for conversion, not curiosity. And most of us never notice because the experience feels intuitive.

To work exceptionally well, platforms need a lot of personal data—location, travel history, payment preferences, etc. It may seem like a small trade-off, but that information could travel further than your itinerary ever will. As data misuse

risks, AI-generated phishing now mimics with precision—fake booking confirmations, fraudulent cancellation notices, and cloned customer service chats that look entirely legitimate. AI-generated deception is hardest to spot in moments of urgency, on which scammers thrive, like a last-minute booking or flight change. Always verify directly with the hotel or airlines before acting on an unexpected communication.

Over reliance carries its own risk. Ask a platform about visa requirements, and it may deliver an answer that is out of date. Restaurant recommendations may favour paid

algorithmic placements over organic ones.

When AI handles everything, travellers lose the instinct to navigate uncertainty.

The case for humans in the loop

This is where a travel agent earns their place back. A good agent knows that the cheapest flight has a six-hour transit and which hotel's sea view is better. They carry professional accountability and have supplier relationships that unlock options no algorithm can surface. For multi-city trips, group travel, and shifting visa rules, human judgement is not just convenient, it is protective. Agents also understand what AI cannot—that this trip is for a family reunion and getting it wrong is not an option.

Who is really leading the journey?

AI has made travel easier to plan, budget, and experience a place. But we need to ask: how much of the journey are we willing to hand over?

Leverage the tech. Just remember who is holding the ticket.

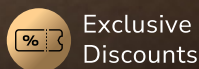

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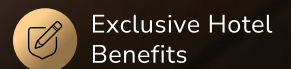
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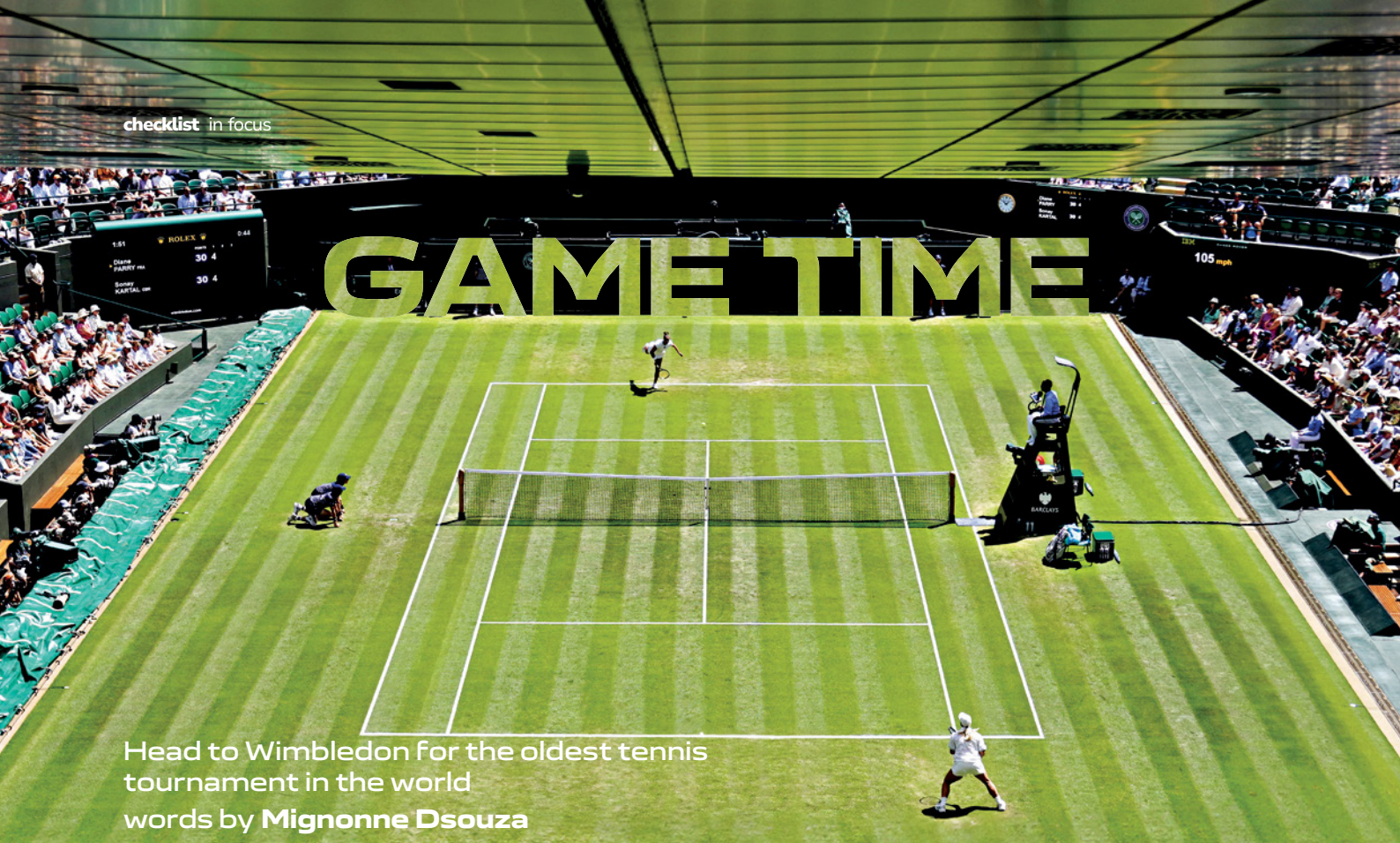

From its iconic grass courts to the strawberries and cream dessert, Wimbledon combines the best of British culture along with world-class tennis action. The tournament will see last year's men's singles winner, Jannik Sinner, and 2025 women's champion, Iga Świątek, return to defend their titles. While former title-holder Carlos Alcaraz has had to drop out owing to a wrist injury, another former winner Serena Williams, is making a comeback.

Whatever the line-up, some things will never change. It is not just the players who observe a dress code at Wimbledon. Spectators, too, are 'encouraged' to wear smart casual attire and eschew dirty sneakers and ripped jeans. The atmosphere is also decorous, with crowds mostly maintaining a respectful silence, all of which has made Wimbledon the Grand Slam tournament to be seen at.

That is most clearly seen in the celebrity quotient, with stars like Tom Cruise, Idris Elba, David Beckham,

Priyanka Chopra Jonas, and of course, Catherine, Princess of Wales, who is a royal patron of The All England Lawn Tennis Club (AELTC), making appearances in the Royal Box. As the tournament is one of the few that offers same-day tickets, true fans always have a shot at watching the action live.

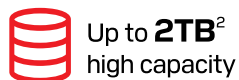
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A SPACE DYSSEY

In Bengaluru, theatre performances are migrating from traditional auditoria to newer, more intimate locations

On the rooftop of the Bäcker & Charlie bakery, theatre maker and educator Nisha Abdulla is putting together a new performance space, Slo. While this, like others, will seek to invite artistes, encourage artistic collaborations, and build a community, Abdulla aspires to do all of that without the formality typically associated with established venues in the city, like Ranga Shankara, Jagriti Theatre or Bangalore International Centre (BIC). Bengaluru, like other cities, is witnessing a 'third space' renaissance—a return

to formats that allows audiences the comfort of enjoying performances without entering formal establishments. Today, theatre thrives in smaller spaces for a variety of reasons—from tight budgets and accessibility to the liberty to choose themes.

A shifting perspective

Traditional venues (with audiences seated in front of a stage) are still popular. But for a while now, performance art collectives like Last Page Collective, Adavi Arts Collective, The Self Centre, Kathalyst, The Ennui Collective, and Qabila, among

others, are increasingly taking their stories and scripts to smaller, black box venues (a simple room with flat floors, no dedicated seating, and no fixed stage). Such spaces allow them greater room to push creative boundaries. This is a win-win scenario for performers and audiences. "If we rely only on people finding regular performance spaces, it does not bridge the existing fissures in our society," stresses Abdulla, adding that the exercise to making theatre productions venue agnostic and accessible is aimed at engaging as diverse an audience as possible.

Smaller venues also cater to an overwhelming factor in the theatre-making journey—money. Although performing in smaller venues does not completely take the financial burden off—there is still money to be spent, budgets to be tightened, and grants to fight for—it does take some heat off. Perhaps, this concern also lends to artistes adopting a design-first approach. Theatre performances hosted in intimate spaces rely heavily on set design that is portable, cost-effective, and accessible. This, in turn, lends to artistes focusing on improv, gearing them to adapt to different spaces and audiences.

New beginnings

In addition to being relatively cost-effective, Bengaluru-based theatre maker and co-founder of The Ennui Collective and Last Page Collective, Samragini Dasgupta opines that one of the major factors drawing artistes and audiences to black boxes is how intimate they feel. “In a black box, audiences are as much a

part of the story as the performers,” she points out. This perhaps explains the ease of it all—spaces like Shoonya Centre for Art & Somatic Practices, DamnGood Studios and OffStage - Grounds For Practice, for instance, host regular programming of workshops, performances, and movie nights, among other events. So, if theatre were to be added to the mix, passers-by looking in could glance at the schedule and sit in for a performance. “We wanted to create a space that enables artistes to explore their craft without having to navigate the rigid outlines of bigger institutions,” says Parth Bhardwaj, one of the four co-founders of OffStage.

It is perhaps the comfort that also allows theatre makers to explore the discomfort that confronting certain themes and subjects brings. For example, Abdulla’s *We Push The Sky*—a one-actor play that explores how political differences impact friendships—begins with tea being served to the audience

and ends with the actor joining the audience for a discussion. While the play has been staged in traditional theatres, narrating such stories in community centres and black boxes allows for gentler engagement.

So are such venues a stepping stone for theatre makers before they take their productions to larger venues? Far from it. “People said theatre is a dying art 100 years ago; they say it even today. The reality is that theatre has managed to grow because of its continuously changing forms and mediums,” says Dasgupta.

Black boxes and intimate spaces naturally enable this effort. Smaller venues—even those carved out within larger establishments like galleries—run parallel with larger venues, offering completely different experiences and creating space for diverse discourses. Moreover, for Abdulla, the next step is to make alternative spaces free of cost. “While this is tricky to achieve, we are taking it slow,” she signs off.

All paths lead to biryani in Hyderabad. The culinary crown jewel has two distinct schools—the first is a dum-cooked *kacchi* variety that seals raw marinated mutton and parboiled basmati together with whole spices under a dough-laced lid. This is slow cooked until the meat surrenders its juices into the rice. The second, *pakki* style, uses pre-cooked components that are layered. *Salan*, made with peanuts and sesame seeds in a spicy tamarind gravy, serves as a tangy-spicy counterpoint, completing the ensemble.

Where to try it: Hotel Shadab, Madina Circle, Charminar, Ghansi Bazaar

TO TRY IN HYDERABAD

The 'City of Pearls' combines a Nizami culinary soul with the quintessential staples of Andhra cuisine

➔ IRANI CHAI AND OSMANIA BISCUITS

Brewed on a dual-vessel system, this chai is a thick, aromatic legacy of communities that once travelled from erstwhile Persia to the city. It is prepared in two separate saucepans—a strong tea decoction in one and a slow reduction of full-fat milk in the other—and mixed together only just before serving. Creamy in texture and delicious in taste, the addition of *khoya* (thickened reduced milk) gives it a custard-like body. Butter-rich, mildly sweet Osmania biscuits are an inseparable accompaniment.

Where to try it: Cafe Niloufer, Red Hills, Lakdikapul



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👉 **LUKHMI**

Hyderabad's anytime snack is this flat deep-fried pastry with a decidedly refined pedigree that is wholly different from a samosa. With its refined flour shell, crimped at the edges with precision, and a filling of minced mutton (cooked with ginger, chilli, and whole spices) stuffed in a casing thinner than its triangular cousin, this renders a crisper bite. Served as a starter at weddings and feasts, it was originally a Nizam-era snack but never really a street food, as restaurant owners in the Old City will tell you with slight despair. It is best eaten with a steaming cup of Irani chai.

Where to try it: Pista House (multiple outlets)



👈 **MARAG**

Traditionally, celebratory meals in the city begin with this slow-simmered mutton broth built from tender, bone-in cuts cooked at a near whisper of heat with whole spices—green cardamom, cloves, peppercorns, ginger, and garlic. The pot is set over low heat and left alone for several hours. Collagen from the bones dissolve, producing a dish that has a silken, almost glassy body. Often finished with fried onions and fresh coriander, this is a nourishing soup for any climate. However, during Ramzan, the city pivots to *haleem*—a slow-pounded union of wheat, lentil, and mutton, sprinkled with almond flakes.

Where to try it: Chicha's, 6, Awabs Residence, AC Guards Rd, Veer Nagar, Lakdikapul



👈 **PATTHAR KA GOSHT**

Thin fillets of mutton—marinated overnight in raw papaya paste, yoghurt, and aromatic spices—are cooked directly on a granite slab (hence, the name). Legend has it that it was traditionally the flat stones lining the palace armoury floors heated from beneath by live coals that served as the origin of the technique. The rock distributes heat evenly, drawing out moisture slowly, yielding meat that is tender yet faintly charred. A true rendition (eaten streetside) would have deep smoky flavours, but the tenderness of the meat and the balance of spices can also be found at fine dining restaurants.

Where to try it: Aiwan-e-Khas By Shadab, Madina Circle, High Court Rd, Charminar, Ghansi Bazaar



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📌 **BAGHAAR-E-BAINGAN**

Small eggplants are slit and stuffed with a dry masala made with roasted coconut, peanuts, sesame, and spices. This is then cooked in a tamarind-spiked gravy, which has already been cooked in oil tempered with mustard seeds, curry leaves, and dried red chilli. The technique of *baghaar*, or perfumed hot-oil tempering, is a signature technique of Telugu cuisine. Structurally, it builds up the aromatic base for many dishes of the region, and very few vegetarian dishes carry the depth of layered fat, acid, and spice in a single spoonful the way this delicacy does.

Where to try it: Adaa in Taj Falaknuma Palace, Engine Bowli, Falaknuma



➔ **KHATTI DAL**

The Telangana flavour palate is dominated by a distinctive sourness, derived from different agents like tamarind, sorrel, and even raw mango (in season). A simple lentil preparation using toor dal (pigeon peas), cooked soft, is sharpened with tamarind and finished with a tempering of dried red chillies, curry leaves, garlic, and mustard seeds crackled in oil or ghee. It cuts across the richness of a full Hyderabad meal with deliberate acidity, functioning as a palate corrective with its tart note.

Where to try it: Dine Hill, 10-5-5/2/ 4 To 5, One Downing Street, Masab Tank



GONGURA PACHADI (CHUTNEY)

Sorrel leaves are cooked briefly to reduce its astringency. They are then ground with green chillies and garlic, followed by mixing in hot oil already tempered with mustard and dried red chilli. This is the city's most eloquent acknowledgement that its culinary identity has always been plural.

Where to try it: Theta Theta Telugu, Jubilee Hills



➔ **QUBANI (KHUBANI) KA MEETHA**

Dried apricots are soaked overnight until swollen and then slow-simmered with sugar until the pulp collapses into a rust-coloured compote of honeyed intensity. The apricot kernels are cracked and used as a garnish—an act of kitchen thrift elevated to elegance. Served warm or chilled with a dollop of fresh cream or a spoonful of custard, this is a Nizami dessert that requires almost nothing to be extraordinary and yet completely enamours guests after a rich meal.

Where to try it: Adi at The Leela Hyderabad, Banjara Hills

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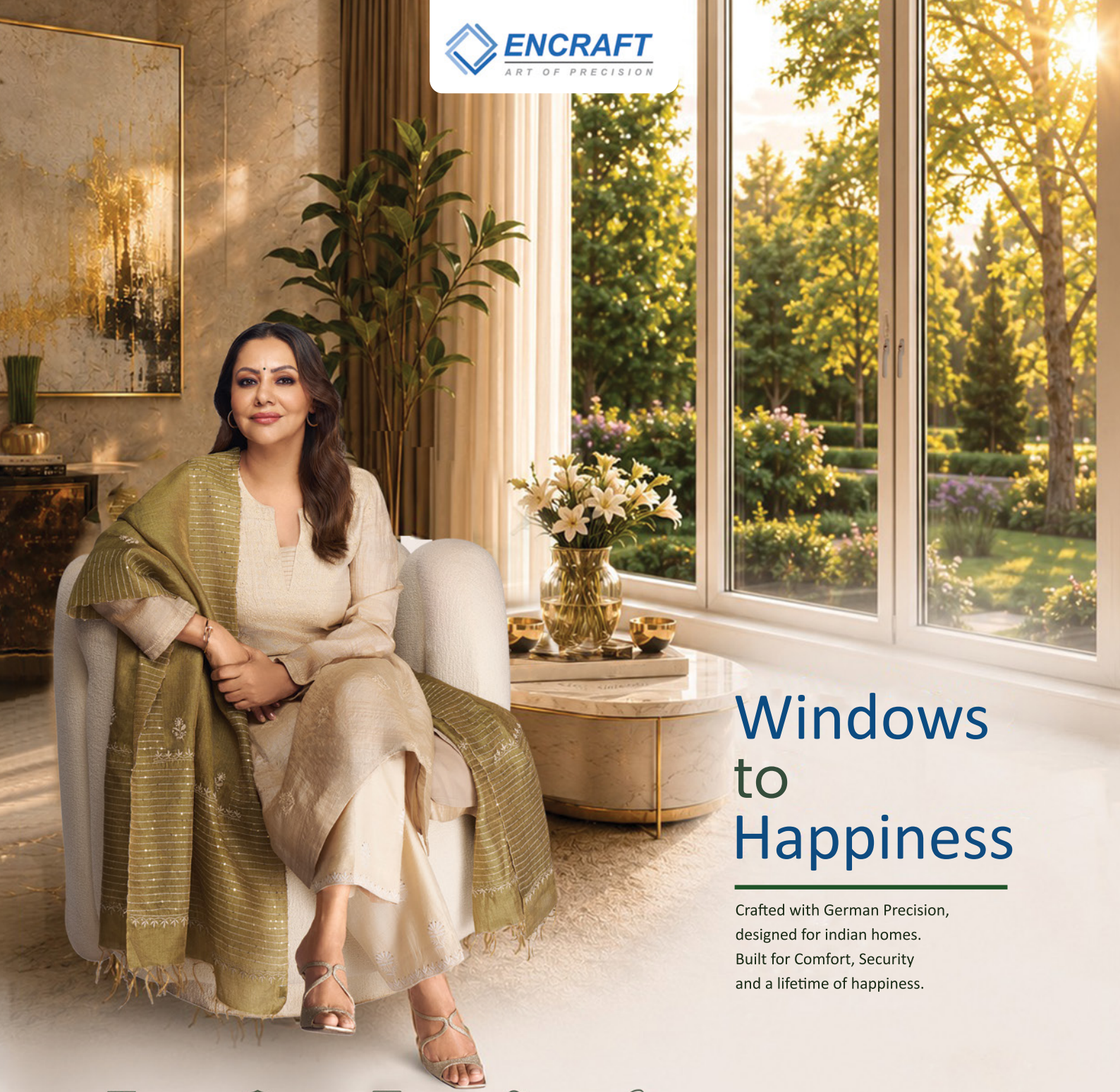

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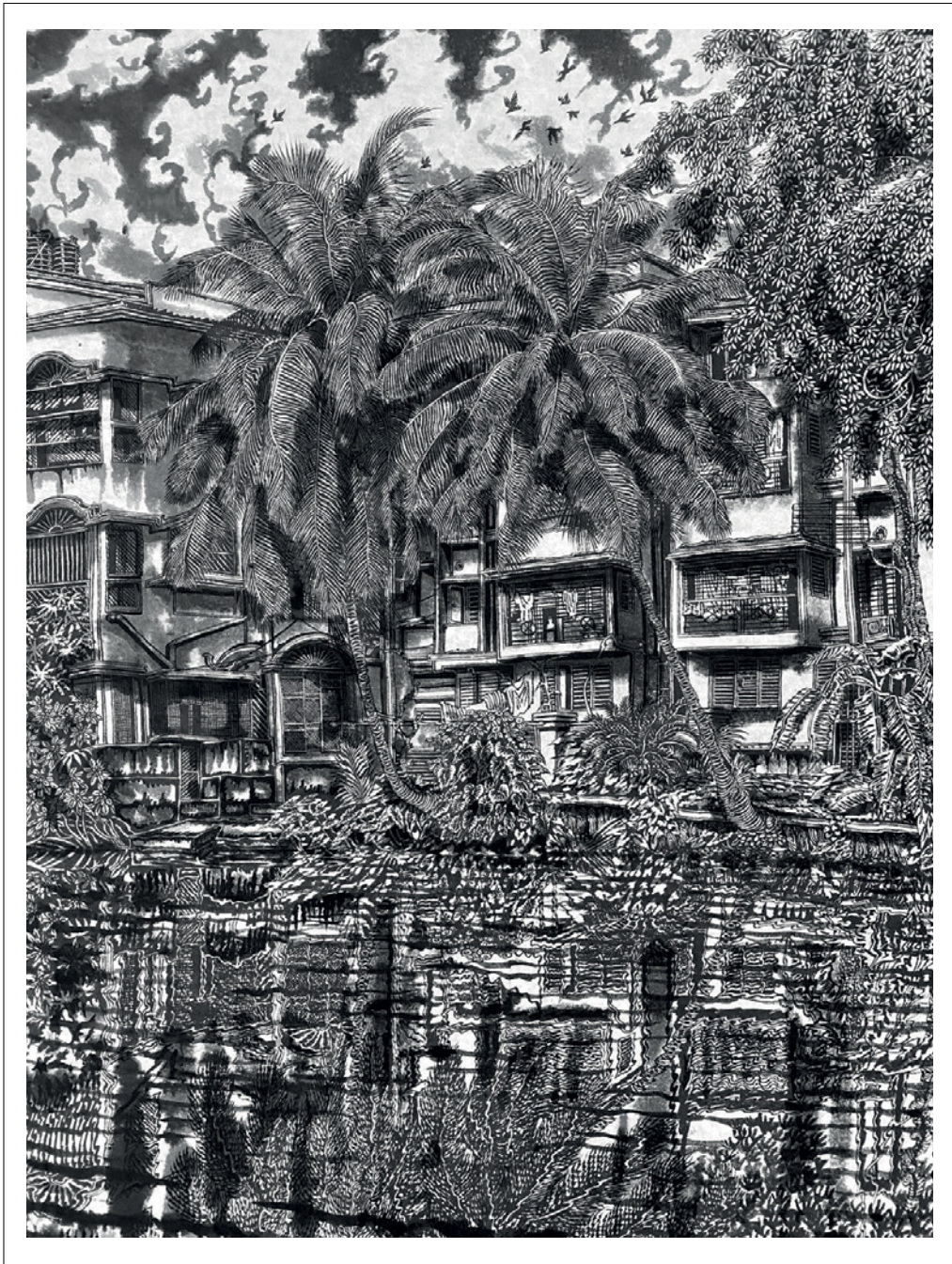

»» KOLKATA IS HOME »»

French artist **Thomas Henriot** pens an ode to the city he has been living and working in for almost two decades

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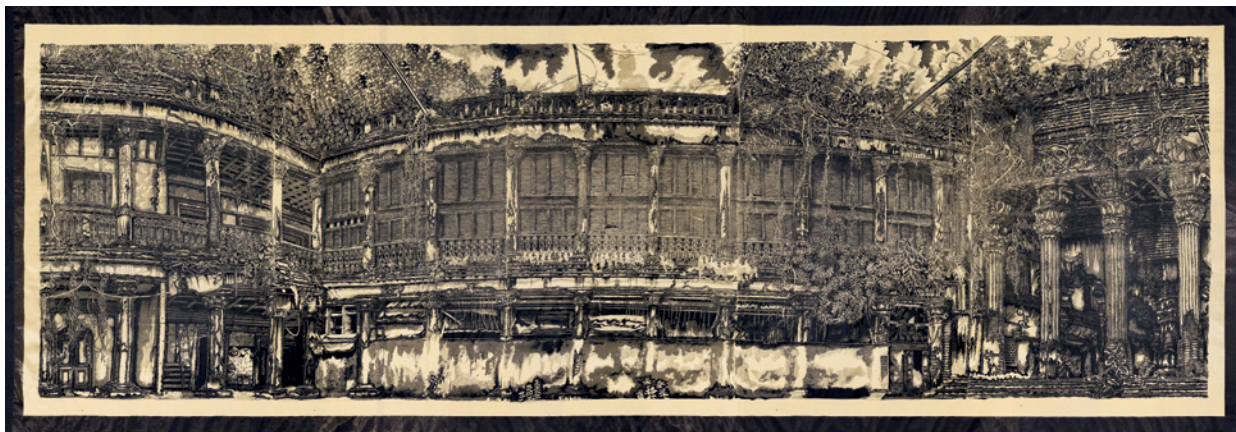
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always had a natural attraction towards India, and I arrived in Benaras in 2004, on Holi. What a meeting it was with the country! I lived there for two years—bathing in the Ganga and working along the ghats. There, I understood that my work is similar to a meditation process. They would call me 'painter babu' and I was convinced India will take care of me and look after me. I was young, only 24, so, this impacted me profoundly.

I came to Kolkata in 2005 and the first thing I noticed was the people. They were incredibly warm and welcoming. In 2012, I was invited by the Basu Foundation for the Arts to do a residency in India. This gave me unlimited access to the Basubati Palace in Kolkata, and I have been painting it for 13 years. It is a mix of architecture and nature, my favourite subject.

The streets are my studio

I have mainly worked in public spaces and my first area of interest is always the street. It makes the space, and the people around it, part of the process. It feels special to sit and sketch on the road for 10 hours. I start quite early, when the coconut sellers and sanitation workers are beginning their day. They are the poorest of the poor yet they offer me water and pay for my tea.

I work in narrow lanes with homes on either side so it is literally like entering



someone's house. And I am always deeply conscious that I should not be disturbing someone. On the contrary, the women come out of their homes and insist I drink water and eat. I do not eat for 10 hours because then I feel sleepy and cannot concentrate. They genuinely worry for me.

I choose to work there because it improves my process. The people's involvement in my art, that cannot be recreated. And it is fantastic—every day I meet the same people. The coconut seller comes every morning with his *beedi* and sits next to me. He wants to recognise the context and follow my progress, and I sort of want him to. It becomes something we share.

Indians, in general, are curious

people. They click pictures of my work and even come back with their families. They have no access to art or probably have not seen art being created like this, let alone by a foreigner. Someone once told me that these people do not see the beauty around them but my art is making them see it.

Once, I remember, they had to create a bamboo structure for an event and they built the entire thing around me without asking me to relocate. And I became part of the context.

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A day in my life

I always seek the ghats and it is the first thing I painted in Kolkata. I sketch near Baghbazar and Shobhabazar or I go to old north Kolkata, close to the river [Hooghly]. I look for ghats close to Kamarhati as I find that area sacred and it always draws me. Every morning, I take a cab or bike and I go to Baghbazar to eat the best street food—*poori sabzi*—from a small corner shop, and they do not alter the spice level for me. I love it! Breakfast has everything I need for the entire day.

When I return home to Jodhpur Park (dwellings provided by the Basu Foundation for the Arts), I spend an hour writing about my day. I do not cook, so sometimes for dinner, I order a Bengali fish preparation. At times, I go to Abar Baithak (a popular Feluda-themed cafe), a meeting point for all sorts of intellectuals—artists, writers, musicians—for their coffee. I may be the only foreigner there but people do not look at me differently. This says a lot about Kolkata. Sometimes I go to Rabindra Sarobar park to take a walk and I am a regular at the Tollygunge Club too.

I know that some people find the city very noisy but I don't hear the noise. It is also the safest city I know. When I reach Kolkata, I can just relax. You can walk through the city in the middle of the night and nothing will happen—it is safer than Paris. In Kolkata, if anything happens, thousands of people are there to help me. I believe Delhi and Mumbai are for business, and Kolkata is for creation. I feel especially understood in this city. I know my place is here.



Giving back

Around 2011, I met Brochier Soieries, a silk manufacturer from Lyon, France, and this led to a project where a team of engineers worked on a high-tech loom on technology created specifically for this, to take thousands of gold threads and weave my work using Jacquard techniques. This exhibition (which included many pieces on Kolkata), *The Weight of Light*, debuted at Art Centrix Space in Delhi this April. My aim was to gift one of the pieces to a Durga Puja pandal as what better way to give back to the city that has given me so much. And in 2025, I was able to collaborate with architect, scenographer, and curator Sayantan Maitra Boka to design the Hatibagan Sarbojanin pandal. We created the aesthetic of the pandal and worked with six young Bengali artists to make

it come to life. Another project close to my heart was also through him—he asked me to travel to the Sundarbans to help create an economy for the women there. Climate change has driven the men away to find jobs, so it is just the women and children left behind. The first time I met them, they had just returned after collecting plants to use for food and medicine, and I realised that their knowledge is amazing. So, instead of teaching them something new, I created a motif from those plants, which they then painted on textiles. As an artist, my purpose is to show people how art can be included in daily life to make it better.

Instinctively, I do not want to bring back anything from Europe to India in terms of art styles or technique. There is already so much richness here.

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BUKHARA'S LIVING Traditions

In Uzbekistan's cultural heart, centuries-old crafts, Silk Road legacies, and everyday life intertwine seamlessly

The first glimpse of Bukhara came to me in shades of sand and turquoise—the desert sun softening centuries-old bricks, the domes shimmering like scattered jewels against a vast Central Asian sky. But it was not just beauty that mesmerised me; it was the quiet hum of continuity.

In Bukhara, history does not sit behind glass—it breathes, works, and whispers through every alley. Recognised by UNESCO as a Creative City of Crafts and Folk Art in 2023, Bukhara wears its legacy proudly. As I stepped into the old city, I felt the echoing pulse of the Silk Road—not as something lost but as something enduring. Traders may no longer arrive in caravans, but the spirit of exchange—of ideas, skills, and stories—remains deeply embedded.

Lyabi-Khauz (Hauz): Where craft and community converge

I began at Lyabi-Khauz, the city's social

heart. Framed by mulberry trees and centuries-old madrasas, the square felt timeless. I lingered by the pool as artisans set up their wares, their hands moving with a confidence inherited via generations. One elderly woman embroidered a *suzani* (traditional Central Asian handcrafted textile), her needle dancing across the fabric in patterns that appeared meditative.

When I paused beside her, she looked up and smiled. "This is not just decoration," she told me, her fingers never still. "Every pattern carries blessings—for weddings, for homes, for life. My mother taught me, and her mother taught her... we remember through them."

Nearby, a young man worked a loom, weaving silk threads into luminous *ikat* patterns—ancient motifs finding new expression. Watching him, I realised how seamlessly the past folds into the present here, each generation adding its own layer, like a palimpsest, to an unbroken tradition.

Bazaars: The hub of traditions

Moving deeper into the bazaars, I found myself surrounded by a riot of texture and colour. Under the domed trading halls, stalls overflowed with hand-embroidered textiles, intricate ceramics, and carved wooden boxes. Each object seemed to carry a story—of lineage, of patience, of pride. I paused often, not just to admire, but to watch. Here, craftsmanship was not a performance; it was daily life.

A rhythmic clang of metal led me to the copper market, where artisans



hammered sheets into bowls and pitchers. The sound rang out like a heartbeat—steady, deliberate. Sparks caught the light as one craftsman polished a vessel until it gleamed like liquid gold. He looked up, wiped his brow, and smiled. “My grandfather worked here, and his grandfather before him,” he said. “Tourists come and go but for us, this is life. Every day we make something that outlives us.”

And then there were the madrasas—majestic, contemplative, and quietly grand. I wandered through the courtyards of Miri Arab Madrassa and

Ulugh Beg Madrassa, their façades adorned with geometric tiles that seemed to shift colour with the sun.

Beyond sites: An evolving city

As I spent more time wandering, I began to notice the quieter rhythms of daily life—women bargaining over spices, children darting through alleyways, and the aroma of oven-fresh bread from neighbourhood bakeries. In a small courtyard, I watched rounds of *non* (bread) being slapped expertly onto the walls of a clay *tandoor*, emerging golden

A CRAFT LOVER'S GUIDE TO BUKHARA

In the city, shopping is not about souvenirs, but about stories you can carry home. Start in the trading bazaars. Look for hand-embroidered *suzani* textiles—each motif symbolising protection, prosperity or love. Silk *ikat* is another must. These vividly-patterned fabrics are still woven on traditional looms. Stop by the copper workshops, where artisans hammer, engrave, and polish vessels using techniques passed down generations. Nearby, ceramic stalls showcase earthy glazes and intricate patterns inspired by nature and history. Seek out hand-carved wooden boxes or jewellery featuring traditional Uzbek filigree. Many artisans are happy to explain their process.

and fragrant. Food here, like craft, felt deeply tied to memory—simple, sustaining, and shared.

Later, I paused at a teahouse tucked into a shaded corner near Lyabi-Khauz, for a cup of green tea as the afternoon stretched lazily on. Conversations flowed around me in Uzbek and Tajik, punctuated by laughter and the clink of porcelain cups. It struck me how hospitality here is not performative, but instinctive. Even as a visitor, I felt folded into the fabric of everyday life.

One evening, I climbed to a quiet vantage point as the sun began to dip, watching the city shift colour—from burnished gold to deep amber, and finally to dusk blue. The domes and minarets formed a jagged silhouette

against the horizon and for a moment, time seemed to collapse in on itself. It was easy to imagine caravans arriving, scholars debating, artisans working by lamplight—scenes that felt distant, yet somehow linger.

In that fading light, the textures of Bukhara felt even more pronounced—the roughness of ancient bricks, the cool smoothness of tiled walls, the soft rustle of textiles in the evening breeze. It reminded me that this city is experienced not just through sight, but through touch, sound, and scent—an immersive tapestry that reveals itself slowly to those willing to linger.

As evening fell, I returned to Lyabi-Khauz. The air cooled, the light softened, and the city seemed

to exhale. Locals gathered, children played, and somewhere in the distance, the faint echo of hammer on metal continued. It was then that I understood—Bukhara is not a relic of the Silk Road. It is its living, breathing heir.

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"RUGBY TEACHES YOU TO NEVER HAVE AN EGO"

Actor Rahul Bose talks about his passion for the sport and the future of the Rugby Premier League

You discovered rugby at a time when it had very little visibility in India.

What drew you to it?

Growing up, there were only two schools in the country where rugby was taught—one in Calcutta [present-day Kolkata] and the one I went to, the Cathedral and John Connon School [Mumbai]. We were encouraged to play all sports, and I took to rugby for all the wrong reasons (*laughs*). Every time I was injured, girls would come to check up on me, and as a young boy, I enjoyed that attention.

What was the rugby ecosystem in India when you started out? How have you seen it evolve?

India was not recognised as an official rugby-playing nation then. So, during the best years of my rugby life, I was not playing for the country. I made my debut at 31 in 1998, as part of the first team that played the first ever test match for India, and I played for 11 years after that. At that time, it was very amateurish. We had a foreign coach, but we couldn't pay him enough, and there was no question of psychologists or nutritionists. Players weren't paid either. On the contrary, we paid out of our pockets, but we had the zeal, and we did everything happily.

Today, we not only pay all our national players but also those who attend the national camp. Now, the sport has become completely rural. Even in urban areas where the sport is being played, it's restricted to the economically depressed areas. We've had three Indian international players [boys] from the slums of Kolkata, and four international and three national players from an economically disadvantaged neighbourhood outside Jaipur. We've had 14 international players from a tiny tea garden estate called Saraswatipur in West Bengal. Today, we have tribal kids from all over the country and players from the absolute bottom of the socio-economic pyramid, playing excellently.



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Why is the sport not pursued as fervently in urban areas?

The reason is twofold. Over the past 25 years, urban India has gravitated towards sports like badminton, tennis, chess, and squash, which offer greater visibility, role models, and clearer career prospects. Rugby, lacking comparable success and heroes, has struggled to attract young players.

At the same time, the sport found fertile ground in rural and tribal India. A breakthrough came in 2006 when students from Odisha's Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences won an international school tournament, prompting the federation to expand rugby across the hinterland. Today, it is played in 322 districts across India, with much of its growth occurring outside major cities.

Tell us about the Rugby Premier League (RPL).

The RPL has been created for three reasons: visibility, infrastructure, and livelihoods. For years, rugby struggled to attract broadcasters because it lacked sponsors, and sponsors because it lacked television exposure. The RPL has helped break that cycle, bringing the sport to mainstream audiences and reintroducing it to urban India.

The league is also creating rugby ecosystems in six cities, with franchises investing in grounds, coaching, sports science, and player development. At the same time, it is generating opportunities for players, coaches, physiotherapists, nutritionists, and other staff. Top players are earning significant sums, while increased visibility is helping create promising pathways in the sport.

Ultimately, the long-term goal is to strengthen the talent pipeline and help India become internationally

competitive, with Olympic qualification a key ambition.

How far along are we with regard to qualifying for the Olympics?

India's Senior Women's Rugby Sevens team is currently ranked 6th in Asia. Since Olympic qualification is determined through continental rankings, the team needs to break into Asia's top 2 to secure a berth. So, in five years, by mid-2031, we should climb four places. Simple. And our men will

follow in 2036. If realised, it would be a landmark moment because in over six decades, the only team sport that has participated in the Olympics from India has been hockey.

How are athletes like [Captain] Shikha Yadav redefining what is possible for Indian women in rugby?

Everything she does redefines it. The way she looks after her body and how she learnt to lead a bunch of women into victory, despite the kind

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of constraints she's faced in her own family and community, is commendable. What she, and every other female rugby player, brings to the sport is something we, as men, can't bring. She's a remarkable sports person and human being. In Shikha's success, you see the success of psychology, strength, and conditioning. And it is women like her who will take us into the Olympics.

How has the sport helped shape the person you are today?

It's an amazing sport and has taught me to face my fears and channel that feeling constructively. It has brought me to the realisation that you can't do anything alone; you need people around you. By nature, I'm an individualist, but this game has smashed it into my body that if you play alone, you're going to die. Quite literally. So, I have now become much more of a team player

than I was. Moreover, it teaches you to have a hot heart and a cool head, and to never, ever, have an ego. It has also taught me to channel my aggression correctly. It helped me learn how to address acute physical pain, day after day, and how to emerge from adversity, because in rugby, you're constantly getting injured. You cannot mull over one injury and think that it's the end of the road. No. You get up and keep playing. That's why I always say: rugby has taught me more about life's ups and downs than my parents.

Speaking of injuries, you have continued filming through some serious ones. What has helped you navigate these injuries and setbacks?

First of all, you should never be an actor and a rugby player. It is really harrowing. It was during my international rugby career, 1998 to

2009, that I did some fine films—*Jhankar Beats*, *Chameli*, *Everybody Says I'm Fine!*, *Mr. and Mrs. Iyer*, *Shaurya*. So, it was harrowing for me to play because every single game was potentially career ending. Not my sporting career, my film career (*laughs*).

The two do not meet, and there is very little in common between them. As an actor, you're taught to focus deeply on yourself; it's the opposite in rugby—you must focus on the game. They're like oil and water; they don't mix. I used to walk into the changing room two hours before an international game and would be taking off make-up in slow, concentric circles, while my teammates were putting on bandages and getting ready. They would look at me and ask, "What the hell are you doing?" And I would say, "I'm just having a moment. Sorry." (*laughs*) I mean, it's crazy. It was a schizophrenic life.



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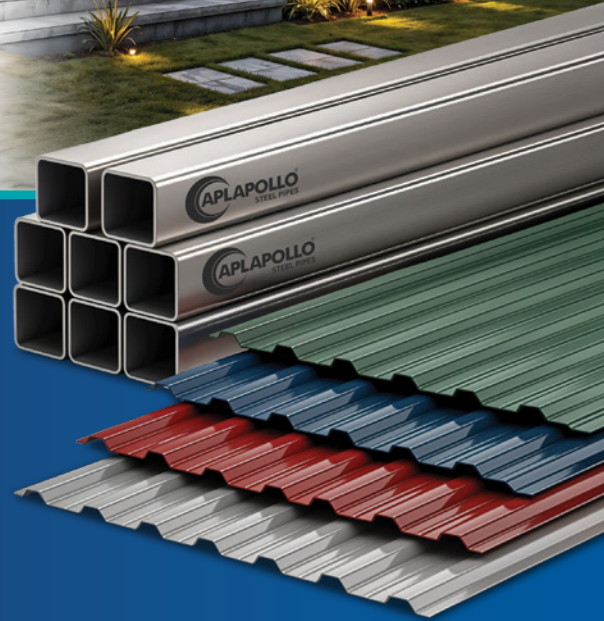
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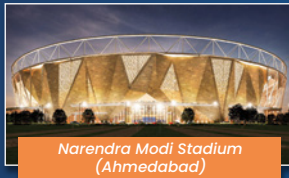
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STAY ON TRACK EVEN ON A HOLIDAY

Nutritionist **Jinal Shah** shares doable pointers on how to ensure you make the right food and exercise choices when on vacation

What is a holiday without good food? A lot of fond memories of any destination we visit are associated with the meals we ate there. And often, we underestimate the power of food on vacation to rejuvenate us.

However, no one wants to come back from a holiday feeling heavier and unhappy. But long or back-to-back flights, jet lag, changes of time zones, and unfamiliar foods can cause a plethora of health issues. This is why planning is key. Making a few wise food decisions can go a long way in

ensuring a holiday is all about the lovely memories. And always remember that 'guilt' is fattening—not food.

Here are some tips that will allow you to fully soak in the destination, enjoy the holiday, and not come back wanting another vacation to recover from the current one.



START WELL

- Carry one salty and one sweet homemade snack (like puris or ladoos). This will serve as a great mid-meal option for a 4-5pm snack.
- When you board your flight, adjust your watch to the local destination time and plan your sleep accordingly. Half your battle is won here.
- Try to stay away from excessive tea and coffee, and stay well hydrated with water. Flights are dehydrating, so avoid alcohol, colas, and packaged juices. Choose cooked meals over ready-to-eat ones.
- On reaching your destination, keep an eye on your water intake.
- Factor in a workout (*surya namaskars*, yoga or cardio) within 12-24 hours of landing.





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PLAN THE DAY SMARTLY

- Eat a fresh fruit or a handful of mixed nuts within 10-15 minutes of waking up. This will replenish the body and help to keep acidity, bloating, headaches, and cravings at bay.
- At a breakfast buffet, first look at the full spread. Then opt for a main dish like eggs and toast, beans on toast or a hot Indian preparation. Select one treat if you want. Do not walk around while eating.
- For breakfast and lunch, try to sample the local delicacies for an authentic experience. Rice meals work well for dinner.
- If you choose to drink, remember to eat first. Have a glass of water between every two drinks. Avoid mixing drinks.



FOCUS ON MOVEMENT

Walk! Ditch escalators and elevators once you land. Your legs will thank you as sitting for long hours is dreadful for them. For exercise, *surya namaskars* work best during travel. Do three sets; it won't take more than 10 minutes, and is equivalent to a good full-body workout. A holiday abroad involves a lot of walking that can lead to aches, cramps or swelling. So, as you end the day, try *supta padangusthasana* to relax your lower back, knees, and ankles.



TREAT THE KIDS RIGHT

- Set your kids a good example by first eating well yourself. Say no to ultra-processed and packaged foods and say yes to local fare. However, since you are on holiday, let them choose one meal a day where they can eat whatever they want.
- Steer them towards healthy options like freshly-made pizza, macaroni, noodles, etc. For the other meal, make them choose something traditional.
- Allow them one dessert on alternate days. But avoid sugary treats at night.
- Avoid letting them have screen time when you are eating a meal.



SPECIFIC TIPS FOR BUSINESS TRAVELLERS

- Make a travel kit that includes a box of nuts, a water bottle, and a small container of ghee.
- Hydrate smartly, instead of indulging in tea or coffee in meetings; opt for *nimbu sharbat*, coconut water, and buttermilk.
- Cashews are a great option to eat in between meetings, to start the



day, and even to end the day. They also work as a stress buster because of their amino acid profile.

- Before going to bed, take a drop or two of ghee and massage the soles of your feet for 30-40 seconds. This ensures restorative sleep, settles one's *vata*, and reduces gas, bloating, and constipation.
- Pick hotels that offer gym access and yoga mats.



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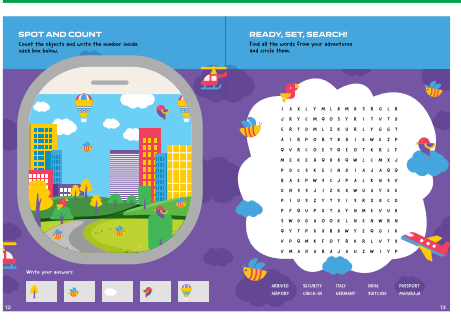
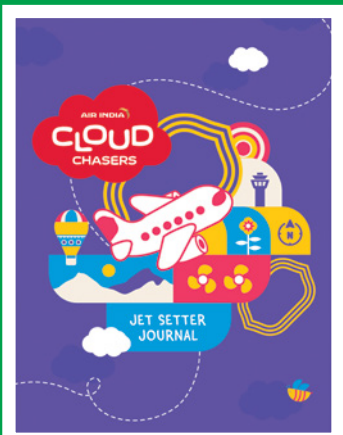

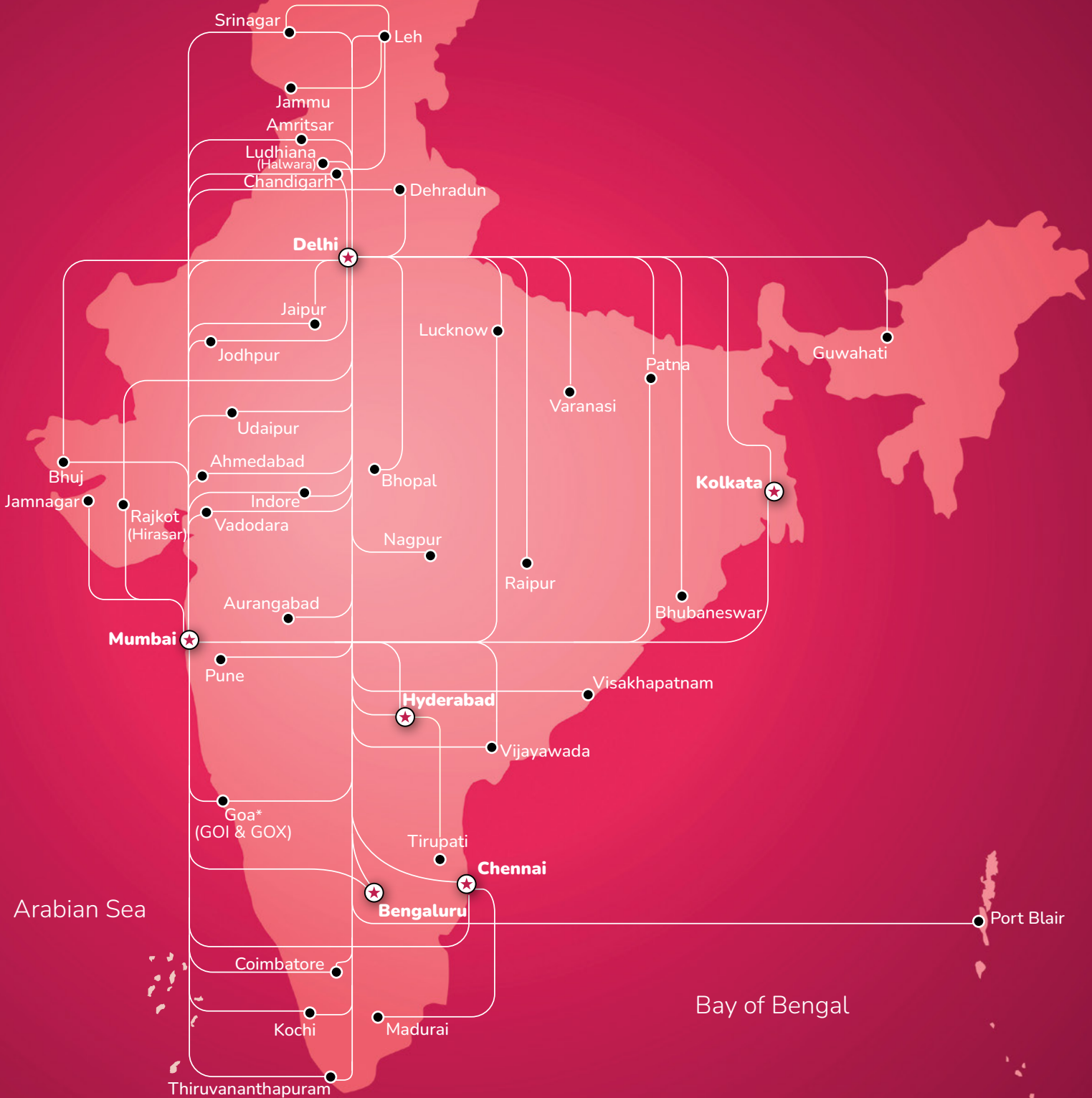
