he first time I felt that 'magic moment' was in Ranthambore National Park. I captured a tigress walking through the early morning mist, and her eyes locked with mine for a second. That image is still etched in my heart. I have always had a passion for shooting wildlife.


It has always been there, I suppose, like a quiet river flowing underneath. No one in my family tree has had this hobby. My father, being a filmmaker, had a keen visual sense. I grew up around cameras and sets, which perhaps sparked something in me early on. But wildlife photography, I discovered on my own. I have loved nature ever since I was a child, enjoying the beauty of the trees, the birds, and the open skies. But it was only much later, after spending time in sanctuaries and forests, that I picked up the camera.

In the Wild

There is something meditative about being behind the lens, observing without interfering. I feel grounded. There is a sense of oneness with the environment; all distractions simply fade away. It is just you, your subject, and that moment, deeply fulfilling. I have understood the moods of natural light over the years. Understanding how natural light falls early morning, golden hour shots, and staying silent; letting the forest breathe without your presence disrupting it—that is the key to shooting in the wild.

IN PURSUIT OF **HAPPINESS**

"On my bucket list are the dream destinations of Borneo and Madagascar. The biodiversity there is surreal. I would love to photograph orangutans in the wild someday. Another animal on my wish list is the rare, mysterious, and elusive clouded leopard. Spotting one would be a dream come true."

There have been many special moments marking my encounters in the forests. Once in Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve, I waited nearly seven hours in the sweltering heat to spot a tigress with her cubs. I was not alone—my guide and a fellow enthusiast were there but we hardly spoke. It was just the hum of nature and then, finally, a silent emergence. Simply magical. There have been times when I have been so transfixed by the sight of a wild animal that I have forgotten to take a shot. Sometimes, the moment

is too sacred to interrupt with a click. You just absorb that moment; let it fill you up. When I had a silent eye contact with a leopard on a tree, I did not even lift my camera. Some moments are just meant to be lived.

There have been experiences that have been so unique and unforgettable in their own way—like the sight of a sloth bear chasing away a tiger in the buffer zone of the Satpura Tiger Reserve and National Park. That is not something you see every day. The forest never ceases to surprise and delight. From Indian forests

like Kanha, Bandhavgarh, and Kaziranga (all three are both a Tiger Reserve and a National Park) to Masai Mara National Reserve in Kenya, every place has its own magic. But Ladakh stands out, perhaps because spotting a snow leopard there felt like a true blessing from nature.

My favourite click, however, is that of a tigress crossing a river in monsoon light at Pench Tiger Reserve and National Park. The water ripples, the low clouds, her muscles flexing—it was poetry in motion.

from around the world—it is very inspiring. Most importantly, I keep going back to the wild. That is where you evolve. As a wildlife photographer, I am mostly self-taught, though I have had wonderful conversations with talented photographers over the years. You learn a lot by observing, experimenting, and even making mistakes.


Nature though, is the best teacher—she has taught me patience, timing, and perspective. I have learnt to respect time, nature, and silence. Life is not always about rushing. It is about finding joy in stillness, in things that do not speak but say so much. In the forest, every rustle, every bird call has meaning. You begin to listen more and speak less, which I think is a beautiful way to live.

Photo Finish

I often exhibit my photographs for charity, as I did recently for the Save Earth Foundation. My photographs were sold, with all proceeds going to causes close to my heart.

To all those who love taking to the lens in the forest, all I will say is—respect the wild. Do not chase the shot, let it come to you. Be patient, stay ethical, and always leave the forest the way you found it, untouched.

he air was still. Not a leaf stirred. It was in the early hours of the morning at the Kimana sanctuary (adjacent to Kenya's Amboseli National Park), around 5am, on 2nd August 2025, when I waited, determinedly yet patiently, with bated breath. camera in hand. All I could hear was a steady rhythm of dried leaves crunching, the sound intensifying and drawing closer with every passing second, till it came to a deafening pause. And then he emerged, barely four feet away from me, in full glory—ears gently flapping, trunk swaying, owning every piece of land he stepped on-Craig. Recovering from a few seconds of being flabbergasted, I did what I came to do, capture this gentle giant in my lens.

Craig is one of the last 25 tuskers remaining in East Africa. His tusks, weighing nearly 100lb each (approximately 45.3kg), as per the latest records, documented on 10th June 2025, are long and symmetrical, curving slightly outward and almost touching the ground. They are also remarkably even, unlike some others whose tusks are mismatched.

I first chanced upon Craig in one of celebrated British photographer David Yarrow's galleries, and I knew I had to see him in real life. But the journey of tracking him began in 2024, with me travelling

to Kenya and interacting with the local Masai people, and making an initial, but rather unsuccessful, attempt to photograph him. But this year, all efforts bore fruit... it is a feeling that cannot be put in words.

This stupendous success, however, would not have been possible without the unwavering and quick-footed support of two individuals. David, a local Masai, who not

only tracked Craig this time around but also informed me well before time and advised me on how best to proceed, and Anthony, my guide.

The next day, I made my way to Ol Pejeta Conservancy on a quest to photograph one of the last two remaining female Northern white rhinoceroses in the world-Najin. My point of contact was my friend, Jeremy Kimathi, a man who has dedicated the last 16 years of his life (and continues to) caring for Najin and her daughter, Fatu.

By the time we reached Ol Pejeta Conservancy on 4th August, Jeremy had set everything in place and immediately whisked my entire team off to the protected area where these two majestic and calm creatures roamed free. Photographing Najin was a breeze but that moment, being there... being so incredibly close to a species so strong yet

so critically endangered, is overwhelmingly life-altering.

Just like Yarrow's work piqued my interest in Craig, the extensive conservation work of Ami Vitale (an acclaimed photographer and filmmaker) on Najin had me dig deeper into the latterher history and family tree which culminated in me being deeply intrigued with the Northern white rhinoceroses.

Two days. Two of the world's most precious wild inhabitants. One unbelievable adventure. Staggering hours of research and seeing photos paled in comparison to watching these animals with my own eyes.

If you ask me to sum up the experience, I would only be able to leave you with this—astounding. Nature has a very beautiful way of whispering to you to stay grounded, to be one with her and all her children... all you have to do, is listen.

IN DEEP WATERS

The Philippines is home to some of the most vibrant marine ecology in the world

The Philippines offers great scuba options for beginners and advanced divers

ave you come across an underwater landscape that prompted you to re-evaluate your life? That was my reaction after I arrived in the Philippines in 2023. I had quit my job in 2018 as an ecologist in England to be a scuba diving travel blogger, and after travelling the world (Thailand, Costa Rica, Ireland, etc.), I fell in love with Bohol Island, especially Panglao, and settled there to obtain my scuba diving instructor licence.

One of the things I love about diving in the Philippines is the sheer variety of experiences one can have. One of the most special dive locations is Coron, in north Palawan (around 300km from Manila), where 10 sunken Japanese warships from World War II form a unique marine environment. The ships are covered in a lot of hard coral and are used as shelter by turtles and other marine life like batfish, sardines, and crabs. These ships sank in shallow waters and divers can easily penetrate them through narrow gaps. You can cruise through cabins and decks as well as surface in a large underwater air pocket. It is akin to being in a James Bond movie. A half-day trip from Coron takes you to a site where you can hope to spot dugongs, a marine animal that resembles a manatee. These are an elusive species to spot in the wild.

Malapascua, a tiny island

off the northern tip of Cebu, is where rare marine specimens, like the thresher sharks, live. It is one of the few places in the world with guaranteed sightings. These sharks have an upper tail lobe as long as their entire body, and they use the tail to whip and stun fish for food. If lucky, one can also spot tiger sharks here. Alternatively, one can also make a half day trip to the nearby Gato island, where you can swim through an underwater tunnel to see small crustaceans and molluscs, and perhaps even elusive pygmy sea horses hiding amid sea fans.

Another unique underwater terrain is the silty seabed around Dumaguete, on the southeast coast of Negros island.

sea horses, pygmy frog fish, nudibranch (spectacularlycoloured sea slugs), the venomous blue ring octopus, and colour-changing venomous flamboyant cuttlefish. The last one, especially, is amazing because it not only changes colours and patterns but also the textures of its skin (from smooth to knobbly, and gristly, and back again). It really puts on the most incredible display.

Siguijor, both the land and the reef around it, is another special destination. This is locally called the 'Island of Witches' because of its deep-rooted tradition of folk healing and witchcraft that blends Catholicism with shamanistic practices and folk medicine. Underwater, it is a location within an archipelago, surrounded by the Visayas islands, and therefore, is sheltered from the many typhoons that strike the Philippines. This has resulted in exceptionally healthy coral reefs; you

can spot vibrant corals like staghorn, whip, and cherry blossom here. Living amidst these are many nudibranch. turtles, and reef fish, whilst huge schools of jacks (aka trevallies), a large pelagic fish, can be seen in the open waters nearby.

My hometown, Bohol province, is just a short ferry trip from Siquijor and Dumaguete. It is perhaps the most popular upcoming dive destination in all of the Philippines. One can spot vast schools of fishfrom massive balls of tiny sardines and huge tornados of barracuda to immense swarms of jacks-around the nearby Balicasag Island

and Napaling Reef. The tourist hub here is Panglao, which is home to all manner of life, including healthy corals, turtles, sea snakes, cuttlefish, frog fish, and octopus. The advantage of Panglao is that it is an easy dive location for beginners, making it a great place to get scuba certified.

The dive sites of the Philippines compare quite favourably to other marine areas in Asia, like Thailand or Bali. They are more off the beaten track, and so, you will find fewer divers here, which always makes for a better experience.

DIVING TIPS FOR BEGINNERS

- Practise slow breathing to reduce air consumption under water, which helps you dive longer.
- Get your own mask. A proper fit means no leaks or fog.
- Do your e-learning earlier. Most programmes can send you the theory section of The Open Water Diver course online.

© BRITISH COLUMBIA OYSTERS

On my first oyster trail here, I discovered that an oyster's location is a key factor. This phenomenon, known as 'merroir', gives each a unique flavour profile based on where it grewin an inlet, a cove or a bay. In the Baynes Sound, I love Fanny Bay oysters for their plump, sugary, and mineral finish, while I prize Kusshi for its buttery, creamy texture. From the Jervis Inlet, I found the Royal Miyagi to be delightful for its kiwi-like aftertaste. However, my favourite is the Pacific Jewel from the Okeover Inlet, with a sparkly finishing note. Oyster purists say they are best enjoyed as is, but I like mine with horseradish, lemon drizzle or mignonette.

Where to try it: Joe Fortes Seafood & Chop House, 777 Thurlow Street

→ CHICKEN SOUVLAKI **WRAPS**

A souvlaki is an iconic Greek street charcoal-grilled aroma caught me right off the street and before I knew it, I was perched on a high chair in anticipation. What came next did not disappoint. The seasoned chunks of chicken were grilled to tender, juicy, and crispy perfection, and all of this was gift-wrapped in a bed of pita with chubby fries and a drizzle of tzatziki, taking it to the next level. Where to try it: Skewers Souvlaki Pita Bar, 26 Powell Street







GRILLED CHEESE

In a city where grey skies and rain are sometimes a way of life, the sizzle of butter in the pan is a golden promise. This simple but ever-so-comforting grilled cheese, on whole wheat sourdough and stuffed with rich, smoked applewood cheddar, is a gooey, cheesy, warm hug on a plate that I did not know I needed. Cheese lovers should try the Comox Brie, made by Natural Pastures Cheese Company on Vancouver Island. A celebrated Canadian cheese known for its buttery ivory colour and creamy texture, it has won many accolades, and pairs delightfully with nuts, crackers, fruit preserves, and honey. Where to try it: A Bread Affair, 1680 Johnston Street

WILD PACIFIC SALMON

Only a few things in life come as close to perfection as a flawlessly-grilled wild Pacific salmon. With its flaky yet incredibly moist flesh and a rich, bold flavour, this is a meal I can eat anytime. Pair it with Chardonnay or a wheat beer. Try the spectacular 33 Acres of Sunshine, a French-style wheat beer with a hazy blonde and a dreamy finish of orange peel, coriander, and anise seed. Where to try it: Carlino restaurant, 1115 Alberni Street






GREAT B.C. ROLL

This was created in Vancouver by Chef Hidekazu Tojo in the 1970s, to appeal to Western palates not used to eating raw fish. He used barbecued salmon for an appealing flavour. The crunchy roll is prepared in the *uramaki* style, with the rice on the outside and cucumber, nori (seaweed) on the inside, a technique Tojo pioneered to hide the seaweed. To finish, a teriyaki glaze is brushed on. Where to try it: Tojo Restaurant, 1133 W Broadway

This delightful dish instantly transported me back to my oncelived life in Bangkok, where there is always room for another bowl.

Prepared with prawns, kaffir lime, lemongrass, and galangal, this fragrant soup is a delicious argument between fiery chillies and sour lime. Every spoonful was a reminder that life, like this soup, is always better with a little spice, if not a lot of drama.

6 NANAIMO BAR

I do not know if this is the best dessert in the world, but I do not want to find another. character called Prague or Paris. I keep my eyes open for interesting locations to set action or conversations or to create codes or to challenge Langdon in some way. For example, in *The Secret of Secrets*, he has to get in a tiny elevator to go up to the top of a tower. I got in that elevator and hated every minute of it. It was tiny, old, and scary. And I decided, well, I must find a way to use this tower. So, the location, really, in many ways, starts to shape the plot. All these locations start to create pillars... the geographic pillars on which you start to build the book.

Do you keep a note of those little, tiny details to incorporate them in the narrative?

Oh yes! Definitely. And I do a lot of writing while I am there, rather than taking a picture or video or just making a note, like, 'Hey, use this alley'. Because, really, reading is a written medium;

Any travel memory that has remained with you long after your visit?







Any future possibility of Langdon having an adventure in India?

Don't think I haven't tried to (laughs). I mean, it is certainly a very logical place for Langdon to go. It is filled with history and symbolism, and so many different spiritual traditions all coexisting—it is fascinating. But truth be told, I do feel like I do not know enough yet to write about it. I believe it would almost be disrespectful until I have a better understanding. I need to come and spend some time in India.

Writing, however, was not the first thing that you did; it was music. When did you realise that words were your calling?

I wrote a lot as a little kid. In fact, I dictated stories to my mom, and she would write them down. I wrote my first book at age five—The Giraffe, The Pig, and The Pants on Fire; I drew the

pictures too. I played a lot of music as a kid, and studied creative writing and music composition in college. When I got out of university, I had a choice between writing books and music. At age 20, I thought music was going to be much more fun. And so, I went out to Los Angeles, got a record deal, and made a record with a prominent British record producer. And it sold a total of 12 copies. My mom bought 10 of them, I am guessing (laughs). It was a commercial failure; and about that time, I had an

idea for a novel. So, I wrote it [Digital Fortress] and the very first publisher who read it, bought it and it sold 12 copies. Mom bought 10. Then I wrote Angels and Demons [first appearance of Robert Langdon] followed by Deception Point; nobody bought those either. I switched publishers and wrote The Da Vinci Code and that book found an audience... a big audience. Eventually the first three 'failed' books went on to become Number #1, and I did not change a single word in any of them.

At the uppermost level, the rooftop buzzes with energy. I watch people swinging from pull-up bars, leaping onto floor trampolines, and crawling up a spiral tower. It is Konditaget Lüders, a rooftop gym and playground perched atop a multi-storey car park. Public space is scarce down below, and Konditaget cleverly transforms urban necessity into an active lifestyle hub that blends quintessential daily activity, like parking

your car, with a workout in fresh air with a sea view. Just Copenhagen doing what it does best: making life better through design.

Just a short walk, still in Nordhavn and now feeling hungry, I take a lift to the 17th floor of The Silo building. An erstwhile grain silo may not sound like a visit-worthy place; but make no mistake, it is now one of the fanciest buildings in the neighbourhood, and an award-winning,

posh residential address. The rooftop has its own accolades for the food. At Silo CPH, I order the famous Danish open sandwich, the smørrebrød, which comes with a panoramic view of the harbour. It is a mix of social bar, lounge, restaurant, and private party venue.

Two metro changes an easy breeze with Copenhagen's seamless public transport system and its Copenhagen Card—and I find myself at Refshaleøen,

staring up at a ski slope. Well, this is Scandinavia, and yes, it could easily be one of those clichéd things to tick off on a Nordic bucket list. But unlike its cousin, Oslo, Copenhagen does not have hills in its backyard. But the city is not about to let that stop anyone. Therefore, once again, design steps in, ensuring residents do not miss the joy of downhill gliding, even in a flat city.

CopenHill is a massive, sloping rooftop perched atop a fully-functioning waste-to-energy plant. That's right; beneath your skis, tonnes of rubbish are being transformed into clean energy. Seasoned skiers carve down a run, the length of an Olympic half-pipe. For non-skiers, there is a rooftop hiking trail and the world's tallest climbing wall.

My next stop is Filmtaget, the rooftop terrace of Cinemateket, an all-weather cinema roof dedicated to Danish film culture. I arrive just in time for their May and June series, Women of Change, a spotlight on bold female voices. The screen lights up, the city fades, and I am completely pulled in. However, there is plenty of magic off-screen as well. From up here, you get a cracking view of Rosenborg Castle and the King's Garden.





Art, skyline, and a touch of royal drama from one rooftop seat is not a bad deal at all.

In Østerbro, I stand in front of a structure wrapped in glass, a building that once served as a car auction house. From the street, nothing about it suggests what lies on the top. But upstairs, I am transported to a metaphorical bridge between the countryside and urban life. This roof is a working, growing urban farm called ØsterGRO.

Up here, on a 600sqm terrace, rows of vegetable beds stretch across the space. Rabbits, chickens, and bees make their homes

among kale, carrots, and herbs. A narrow paved path cuts through the gardens, leading to Gro Spiseri, a small greenhouse restaurant offering organic, farm-style meals. In the evening, long tables glow under string lights and the aroma of herbs fills the air, creating the perfect setting for a slow, seasonal dinner. But ØsterGRO is more than just a pretty green space. It prompts one to ponder the natural cycle and rhythm of seasonality, and how easily it can be forgotten in a world of supermarkets where everything is available all the time.

Nilgiri tahr on escarpments, dugongs in the Andaman meadows, gharials in Chambal, and red pandas in Singalila National Park (West Bengal). On Odisha's beaches, Olive Ridley turtles climb ashore by the thousands to nest under moonlight. Each is as profound as a tiger on the track. These are not side notes—they are the fabric itself.

BE MINDFUL OF YOUR FOOTPRINT

When you walk onto a reserve, you also decide the story you will be a part of. Some lodges tout eco-credentials as a badge, others integrate them into daily operation. The key is in tiny specifics: are guides recruited from neighbouring villages? Does rainwater help feed local gardens? Does the conservation fee that some lodges charge, reach rangers or teachers? I have watched visitors understand that their rupee has a pulse—that an honest wage keeps a kid in school, that a levy pays for patrols on a river. That is when travel transforms from consuming to conserving.

Stewardship starts with ground-level choices. Putting trash in a bin is no better if it goes in an open fire. Few reserves have robust rubbish disposal systems, so guests need to be advised: take back

everything you carry or pack nothing the wild cannot process. Walking where you are directed also counts. Every shortcut damages plants by crushing them, eats away the soil, and dislodges delicate habitats. There are designated paths so that we may see without wrecking.

FOLLOW RESTRAINT

Other pressures are subtler. Water is

as precious as grass; a short shower is a quiet courtesy. Noise, too, is pollution. The wild has its own music—the langur's call, the splash of a kingfisher, the sigh of sal leaves. To blast music, host DJ weddings or shout on the park edge robs both animals and people of silence. My plea to those who stage such events: go green, lower the volume, let sustainability lead. Even in

accommodation, bigger is seldom better. Large hotels with multiple pools and chemical-heavy upkeep consume more than they give. Smaller, thoughtfully-designed lodges—with genuine eco-friendly policies—offer both comfort and conscience. Luxury in the wild should never come at the wild's expense.

In tiger reserves, restraint is my motto. A sighting is not a trophy, but a privilege. I have seen a tigress laze with her young ones due to the fact that we kept at bay, and I have watched silence turn out to be a lifetime memory. Good guides allow the moment to approach you rather than chase after it. At times, the best stories are the ones you fail to put on Facebook instantaneously. But restraint also means listening. Too often, visitors pressure naturalists, push drivers or offer bribes to enter nontourism zones. Not only is this illegal, it also betrays the forest. The irony is that the best sightings are usually in tourism areas—because animals are used to vehicles and behave naturally. In untouched zones, they vanish when they hear an engine. Respect your guide, trust their judgement. They are more than companions; they are interpreters of the wild, and guardians of its balance.

WHAT WE WEAR

Forests are not meant for fashion shows. Bright colours, perfumes or flashy fabrics startle wildlife and shatter the calm. Choose muted tones and simple clothes that blend into the landscape and respect both the dignity of the wild and the culture of the people who live alongside these spaces.

SMALL ACTS HAVE BIG IMPACT

The wild does not owe us a show. It has endured monsoons, droughts, and centuries of silence. But we need the wild—for humility, balance, and the reminder that we are custodians, not owners. More travellers are beginning to understand: choosing smaller camps, carrying waste home, supporting edge communities. Each small act leaves a trace of care.

When the gate swings wide tomorrow and the track stretches out before you like a promise, ask yourself: will the journey make the forest stronger for you to have found it? Flying might bring you here, but it is how you walk once you land that will decide the future of India's wild spaces.

A MOVEMENT IN TIME

Watching the wildebeest migration in the Masai Mara National Reserve is one of those experiences that stays with you forever words and photographs by **Capt. Mike A Johnsingh**



There is always an element of luck involved when you plan to watch the famous wildebeest migration that takes place every year in the Masai Mara National Reserve on the borders of Kenya and Tanzania. The reason for this is that the actual crossing of the herds across the Mara and Sand rivers happens in just a few minutes, so you could be in the area and still miss it. The other variable element is the weather—when it rains, the wildebeest do not want to get into the water. We spent a couple of hours waiting with bated breath for the wildebeest to cross, all the while hearing their thundering hooves and the specific grunting sound that they make. The crossing is complicated by the crocodiles and lions that lie in wait for the wildebeest, and watching them snatch their prey is live theatre, quite simply one of the wonders of the natural world.



IN THE FRAME

Photo tours let you focus on different species under the able eyes of a guide, but animal welfare must always be paramount

magine devoting three days to tracking a wild animal and shooting it with your camera, with expert guidance from professionals throughout. If you are a photography enthusiast and you love wildlife, then a photography retreat is just what the doctor ordered. Growing in popularity, they give you a rare chance to shoot elusive species high up in the mountains or hiding in the dense foliage of rainforests. You get to disconnect from the stress of everyday life and focus on just the outcome. Here are some photo retreats so you can choose the one that best fits your interests.

SAFARI PHOTOGRAPHY

The core principle of wildlife photography is the realisation that you are entering the animal's territory. "Respecting their space is vital, yet many safari operators neglect briefing visitors on etiquette. Without this awareness, both animals and tourists suffer—impacting well-being, safety, and the quality of every experience," says award-winning photographer and educator Sudhir Shivaram.

Successful photography, he notes, requires homework and follows two approaches: species-specific (focusing on behaviour or breeding cycles, like tiger cub sightings), and park-based (capturing the range of biodiversity a reserve offers). "Animal welfare must come first. Break the cycle of pressure and set an example," he stresses.

Preparation, the right gear, and ethics are non-negotiable. Binoculars remain essential for spotting, while a 70-200mm lens for habitats and a 200-600mm telephoto cover most needs. Beanbags or monopods come in handy to manage heavy lenses. Shivaram also highlights the role of safari vehicles and crews: "Seek photography-modified jeeps and cut the engines during shots; experienced photographers can even help train guides on the correct positioning for great shots."

When it comes to tiger tourism, overcrowding and rule-breaking are common. Shivaram's advice: "Resist pressuring drivers, follow park regulations, and accept that some shots are not worth it. The welfare of the animal outweighs any image."

MACRO AND NIGHT PHOTOGRAPHY

Macro photography opens a window

into nature without costly safaris or far-flung expeditions. "Some of the most striking images—tiny insects, fungi, mushrooms or delicate species interactions—can be captured right in your backyard," says Vipul Ramanuj, an expert herpetologist. By revealing details invisible to the naked eye through affordable macro lenses, this style offers an accessible entry point. "Education is central to ethical macro photography. Herping—photographing reptiles and amphibians—demands location-specific knowledge and safety protocols," Ramanuj stresses. Beginners should start locally before advancing to specialised herping tours.

Guided experiences can help people overcome long-held fears of snakes or spiders, replacing fear with respect and fascination. Orientation before tours can build awareness of species behaviour, conservation issues, and safe practices.

Ramanuj advises enthusiasts to work with experienced guides, never attempt night herping alone, and always prioritise species welfare.

Start with a field quide. binoculars, and a DSLR. The choice of camera depends on purpose and experience. DSLRs or mirrorless bodies work for beginners, while advanced photographers may prefer fullframe, high-speed systems.

"Frogs are especially fragile, while snakes and scorpions can be photographed safely with knowledge and respect. Fear often stems from misconceptions, not reality," he notes. For gear, 90–105mm macro lenses work well, while smartphones with macro attachments provide a strong start. In India, regions rich in night life are best explored pre- or post-monsoon, with October being ideal.

HIDE PHOTOGRAPHY

As the name suggests, this involves not being in the line of sight of the subject. "Hide photography is all about patience, focus, and discipline," savs wildlife photographer Shivang Mehta. Sessions often demand hours of stillness, with unique rewards. "From intimate portraits to wide-angle frames triggered remotely, hides give you creative freedom," he explains. Success, however, hinges on balanceequipment, subject distance, and, above all, respecting natural behaviour. Ethical concerns remain central. "Baiting is always debated. While waterbodies, bird feeders or salt licks

may be acceptable, using live bait crosses the line," Mehta says. He advises tailoring

lenses to the subject,

"Telephotos for birds, a 70–200mm for mammals, and remote wide angles for environmental shots." In India, hide photography is still evolving and is primarily bird-focused. Notable locations include Kipling Hide at Pench Tree Lodge and the Jamoon hide near Corbett, plus seasonal hides in the Western Ghats. Internationally, African hides at locations like Zimanga and Shompole camps, and Ol Pejeta Conservancy are excellent. "They allow you to photograph everything—from lions and elephants to rarities like caracals, often with advanced lighting set-ups," Mehta notes. His golden rule: "To prioritise ethics and patience, because authentic encounters create the most powerful images."

HIGH-ALTITUDE PHOTOGRAPHY

"High-altitude wildlife photography demands patience, preparation, and ethics," says Erwin D'Rose, Associate Director at Jehan Numa Wilderness. Acclimatisation here is non-negotiable. "Skip it, and you risk serious altitude sickness," he says. Respecting wildlife also means maintaining a distance.

"Use long lenses and never chase a shot," says the expedition leader. Fragile mountain ecosystems also demand restraint. So, "Leave no trace, avoid trampling off-trail, and fly drones only with permission. Silence is critical as noise carries differently up here."

Crews must prepare for volatile weather with contingency plans, work with local trackers and porters, while supporting them to strengthen conservation-minded communities. Regions like Ladakh, Spiti, and Sikkim reward those with physical readiness, ethical restraint, and logistical planning.

"I rely on ZEISS scopes and binoculars for clarity in extreme conditions," D'Rose adds. Must-haves include a sturdy tripod with gimbal head, warm spare batteries, dry bags, and first aid.

BIRD PHOTOGRAPHY

"This begins with clarity of purpose—is it a career, a hobby or conservation?" says Jainy Maria Kuriakose, an acclaimed bird photographer. "That choice defines your gear, approach, and learning curve." Success, she stresses, depends on systematic study. Field guides form the foundation, hence, she recommends the 'plate method'-working page by page,

then reviewing after each trip. "It builds a strong mental database," she says. Progression should be gradual, starting with field guides, then binoculars, and, finally, a camera. Beginners should begin locally at backyards and parks to hone their observation skills. "Birds are fast and elusive. Multiple angles, call recordings, and expert consultations can help." Binoculars are critical. The mantra is simple: "Photograph everything, not just rarities. It documents subspecies,

seasonal plumages, and behaviour while reducing misidentification." For equipment, "a DSLR with a 100-400mm zoom and quality binoculars is an ideal starter set-up". For destinations, she highlights North-east India for thrilling 'birdwaves' of mixed flocks, Ladakh for high-altitude species, and the Andamans for expedition-style birding. "Modern tools-eBird, social media, online ID forums—make birding easier than ever. Use them," she says.



hat sets a walking safari apart is that instead of viewing animals at a distance, you are right there on the ground, with the prospect of coming face to face with a wild inhabitant. You are now equally engaged in the process walking with the guide and feeling the thrill, albeit, with just a wee amount of trepidation. And as you get closer to the animal, speaking in hushed tones, and you see it in front of you, the knowledge that you are barely 100m away, sends your heart racing. A jeep safari cannot match this.



▼ SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK, ZAMBIA

This is said to be the 'home' of the walking safari, an idea conceptualised by conservationist and safari guide, Norman Carr, in the 1960s. Set around the Luangwa river, it is home to about 60 animal and over 400 bird species, including hippos, zebras, antelopes, yellow-billed storks, and egrets. Since several lodges remain open all year, visitors can explore the area in both dry and wet seasons—ranging from bare bush in winter (April to October) to a green wonderland in summer (November to March).

The only national park in Zanzibar, it allows visitors to discover hidden gems. Spot rare red colobus monkeys and delve into unique mangrove forests. Other species of fauna found in the area are the Blue Sykes Monkey, and 40 species of birds, including Fischer's turacos, brown-headed parrots, Pemba Sunbird, and Zanzibar red bishops. The best time to visit is from June to October. jozaniforest.com

This park in Madhya Pradesh, best visited between October and June, is home to numerous endangered species, including the Giant Squirrel, the Indian Skimmer, the Black Bellied Tern, and the Leaf-nosed Bat. There is also a chance to spot over 300 species of birds, mainly the Malabar Pied Hornbill, the Paradise Flycatcher (the state bird, locally called *Doodhraj*), and the Malabar Whistling Thrush. Migratory birds like Barheaded Geese and Pintails can also be found here in autumn. forest.mponline.gov.in





NAMERI NATIONAL PARK & TIGER RESERVE, INDIA

Nestled in the foothills of the Eastern Himalayas in Assam, it is a birdwatcher's paradise, with over 300 avian species, including the white-winged wood duck (the state bird). Visit during the peak months (November to April) to spot nearly 29 mammal species, including the *gaur*, *sambar*, hog deer, barking deer, Himalayan Crestless Porcupine, and the Indian mongoose, along with elephants and tigers. *assamtourism.gov.in*

KRUGER NATIONAL PARK, SOUTH AFRICA

This is the country's premier reserve, where visitors can see rhinos, elephants, and other animals typical to the terrain like kudu, klipspringer, and mountain reedbuck (all antelope species). The Nyalaland trail offers access to unique species like nyala, Sharps grysbok, eland, roan antelope, yellow spotted rock hyrax, elephant shrews, and red rock rabbits. One can also spot hippos and crocodiles. Some parts of the park come alive after sunset, allowing tourists to hear the Mozambique night jar, African Scops owl, and other night calls from the camp. Best visited from May to September.



The Kangaroo Island Wilderness Trail here offers a lite version of a walking safari. Located near Adelaide, and best visited in summer, the area teems with wildlife, including rare species like the Kangaroo Island echidna, tammar wallaby, Rosenberg's goanna, brush-tailed possum, six species of bats and frogs, and more. The region is said to be a 'zoo without walls' so, visitors have a good chance of spotting the local wildlife. parks.sa.gov.au

ir India has been a part of my life for over 10 years now. From flying between Pune and New Delhi every month during college to taking my first international trip, the airline has been a major contributor in making me the traveller I am today. So, when I found out that I would be experiencing the new Airbus A350-900 on my New Delhi to London trip with Air India, I was excited. 'A global airline with an Indian heart' is the philosophy that the airline embodies, and this is evident the moment you step onto the plane. The welcoming smiles of the cabin crew, exuding warmth and grace

in their immaculate Manish Malhotradesigned attire, start the journey on a happy note.

FLY LIKE ROYALTY

The Business Class is the real star of the show and makes you feel like royalty. The interiors, in soothing blue and grey hues, are chic and modern. Business Class has 28 suites, with sliding doors providing maximum privacy for the nine-and-a-half-hour journey. The first order of business was exploring my private cocoon, which the cabin crew very graciously helped with. Extremely comfortable seats that convert into snug full-flat beds

(big enough, and more, for a six-ft-tall passenger) meant I would not be landing in London with jet lag and could explore the city, refreshed.

The suites boast a small coat closet, a shoe drawer that comes with a pair of slippers, and a storage compartment for necessary documents—I used this to store my skincare products! I would absolutely recommend taking the window seat as the view of the Hindu Kush mountains, while flying over Afghanistan, is something I won't forget. The window shades also have different settings, allowing you to set the mood in your private den.

ENJOY THE LITTLE TOUCHES

A trip with Air India is never complete without complimentary amenities. In Business Class you will get a soft sozniembroidered woollen blanket and a two-in-one cushion that can be used both as a pillow and bedding. The bespoke amenities kit and the comfortable cotton pyjamas provided ensure a good night's rest.

SAVOUR THE FOOD

The culinary experience is where the brand scores brownie points. The menus have meals from across the world with Indian flavours taking centre stage. My favourites were the idli and upma platters, and the saffron phirni



The programme will be executed in two phases, with the first one (already in action) covering Indian nationals and OCI card holders. In the second phase, foreign travellers would be covered.







I RECOMMEND




